****There is no school on Monday or Tuesday the day of conferences. While your teachers talk with you, the assistants will be available to supervise any children that come with you. There will be sign-up sheets available soon.

****Please remember the conferences are to be brief; 10 to 15 minutes. If you require additional time, please schedule another conference at a later date. These reports are not a reflection of your child's intelligence. It is an observation of where we perceive your child to be developmentally. There will be some children who haven't mastered skills we plan to introduce. This is normal. Please don't feel pressured to teach these skills at home. To avoid a conflict in style or methods, we would prefer you talk with your child's teacher for suggestions and technique.

LUNCH BUNCH:

Lunch Bunch is now available. At this time children need to be potty trained and 4 years old to participate. We will be open to the 3 year olds after the holidays. The time is 11:30-12:30. You will need to sign up before the dates and purchase your ticket for each day you choose to stay. The cost is \$10.00 a day **and it is very important you pick the lunch bunch children up at 12:30PM so our afternoon classes can begin on time.. PLEASE DO NOT BE LATE!!**

With the changes in the weather, we'd like to restate our snow days and inclement weather policy. If Carroll County Public Schools are closed due to weather conditions, we will be closed. If schools' opening is delayed one (1) hour, we will open our morning session one hour late. If Carroll County schools' opening is delayed two (2) hours, we will follow the delayed time schedule. Those times are listed next: AM class time will be at: 11:00 AM-12:45 PM and PM class will be at: 1:15-3:00 PM there will be no Lunch Bunch.

If Carroll County Schools are dismissed One (1) hour early, or two (2) hours early, we will close the same

and we will not have a Lunch Bunch session. If at anytime you feel conditions are too treacherous and schools have not been closed early, please do not hesitate to come and get your child.

Reminder: For the safety of everyone and to abide by the MD state law please do not leave children alone in the car. Parents are willing to help each other out in watching your child while you come into the building. If you need help please see your teacher.

November color: is brown. We encourage the children to look for our monthly color everyday. You may want to use shoelaces, jewelry and clothing to help your child participate.
