If you have submitted all your paper work, we thank you. If your paper work has not been received, in its entirety, please see the Director. It is absolutely vital all paper work is completed and is submitted promptly.

I would like to restate our health and sick policy as stated in our handbook on page 6.

PLEASE READ Children attending school must be well. We will be promoting healthy habits and enforcing our policy.

We like to think of our handbook as a valuable source of information. During these busy times, it is hard to remember all the

details included in the handbook. You may want to keep it handy and glance through it periodically as a refresher. We are a team. Your help is imperative for a successful school experience.

We have a NEW POLICY for this year with birthdays. **You will not be able to provide snack in the classroom of any kind** although you are welcome to provide napkins, plates and cups for the class. You also may provide a non-food goody bag to be sent home with each child in the class.

We will be talking about a different character trait each month. We will talk about the importance of character trait lessons. This will help children deal with situations that they experience in life with the self- control, respect, honesty and the responsibility to make the right choices. Our first trait we will talk about will be RESPECT. The definition of respect includes how you treat others and how you feel about someone else and yourself. We will talk about how respect means showing others that you care for them by treating others (meaning their peers and authority) kindly and not saying mean and hurtful things. As parents we need to remember to model for children to reinforce these lessons.

In regards to totes, we request each child have a tote bag or back pack. **Totes or back packs should be bought to school daily.** It is a lesson in responsibility. We expect the children to be responsible for

their totes or back packs to and from school. In the four year old class and the Pre-K class the students pack their own totes. If it is too small to get everything into the tote, it defeats the purpose. Please refrain from adding any adornments, such as key rings etc. to the totes as they create distractions. As with all personal things, please clearly label. We offer cinch totes for sale at a cost of \$10.00. Please see the director if you are interested in purchasing one.

During our school year we will offer fundraisers. We are able to keep the cost of tuition at a minimum and purchase new equipment with the help of successful fundraisers. We realize that everyone is busy and so we try to select fundraisers that are easy and useful, however, **if at any time you would prefer not to participate in fundraisers and would rather make a monetary donation we would gratefully accept any amount you feel is appropriate.**

September Color is yellow. The 3's have color days on Thursdays and the Pre-K's will have color days on Fridays. We encourage the children to look for our monthly color on a daily basis. You may want to use shoelaces, jewelry, and clothing to help your child participate.

September Theme is "off to school". We hope to help the children learn the names of their classmates, feel at home in their new environment, and help them develop skills necessary for success in school.

Parent Reminder: No child should be left in a car during drop off or pick up. Please

make a plan to have another family watch your child in your car or walk your student into the building.

Dismissal Time and Drop Off Time

The policy for dropping off your child; you will now need to sign them in every day. This is the Maryland State Department of Education's policy. Please help us to follow their guidelines. The 2's and 3's will enter and pick up from the front doors and the pre-k classes will enter and pick up from the back door to help with the congestion on the ramp. Any children coming for just the afternoon will enter from the front door.

Please remember, as stated in the handbook on page 4, at dismissal the adult that comes into the building to pick up your child must be listed on your child's emergency card or have written permission from you to sign your child out. Everyone must show photo ID, even if you have been to the Center before. Please bear with us the first few weeks as we get to know your faces and remind anyone new that is picking up your child to bring their photo ID. Thanks, for your cooperation in this very important safety measure! We also have new late pick up policy be read on page 4 of your handbook.
