Multipurpose Room Roof

Our multipurpose room roof shingles were replaced in June. The cost was \$20,500.00!

Fortunately, we had the funds to go forward with the new roof but spending the \$20,500 significantly depleted our finances. We are grateful for the \$7,000 we have received so far but are still hoping to replace the entire \$20,500.
